<p>When will the school officially end?</p>	<p>We are working with Superintendent Kamras to develop a seamless plan for the district.</p>
<p>How will we stay connected with our school community?</p>	<p>We are committed to checking emails, grading assignments, updating our school website, posting on our Instagram accounts, and holding class meetings via Zoom and Google hangouts.</p> <p>For quick, timely updates, please follow Mrs. Massenburg’s Instagram page (principalmassenburg) and/or the school's (rchspharaohs).</p>
<p>How will we determine year-end grades for our scholars?</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> Scholars will be granted a period of time, but no later than Friday, April 17th, to submit assignments to teachers. Except for materials (including "packets") specifically created in anticipation of our school closure, anything assigned <i>on or before</i> Friday, March 13 is <u>mandatory</u> (which means that non-completion will negatively affect your grade) Anything assigned <i>after</i> Friday, March 13 is <u>strongly encouraged</u> (which means that, while non-completion will have no effect on your grade, completion will have a positive effect). <p>How will teachers access student work and promote its completion?</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> Teachers will reach out to their scholars to encourage them to use this extra opportunity to complete work before we close out for the year. They will send emails and any other form of communication that they typically use to reach their scholars. Mrs. Massenburg has also sent this information to all parents, placed it on our school’s website, and posted it on social media.



	<p>2. We would like to give scholars the opportunity to submit work they have completed. We prefer for scholars to submit their work by taking a picture, scanning the document(s), or emailing it directly to the teacher. If these options are not available, we are allowing work drop-off on Thursday, April 16th and Friday, April 17th ONLY, from 9am to 11am at Richmond Community High School. Once again, this is ONLY for those that are unable to submit through one of the preferred methods above. Please keep in mind, scholars will not be penalized for incomplete or incorrect work after March 13th. However, we want to provide the opportunity to submit work to help their grades.</p>

<p>Will we continue to have access to Google Classroom?</p>	<p>Teachers and scholars will have access to Google Classroom through June and will assist scholars if they have difficulty logging in.</p>
