



Middle School Boundaries




River City Middle School Boundary



The River City Middle School zone is currently in the center of Richmond's south-side. Its northern border is the James River, spanning from State Route 76 (Powhite Pkwy) in the west to I-95 and the James River in the east. The southern border of the zone is the Richmond City boundary line spanning from State Route 150 (Chippenham Pkwy), Falling Creek Reservoir, and a portion of Walmsley Blvd. River City Middle School is located in the southern portion of the zone (identified by a red star on the map).




River City Middle School Boundary Sections




The northwest section of the River City Middle School zone extends west of Westover Hills Blvd. (State Rte 161). It includes the Westover Hills (northern portion) and Forest View (southern portion) neighborhoods, and a small portion of the Northrop and Belt Center neighborhoods. It lies within the Westover Hills Elementary School zone, save for the very southernmost portion, which is in the Elizabeth Redd Elementary School zone, and two high school boundaries (Huguenot and Wythe). The approximate center of Section 1 is approximately 4.5 miles from River City Middle School (driving).

Data for this section does not include school age students living in the zone who are not enrolled in RPS. RPS ES students may move, attend out-of-zone schools via Open Enrollment, or enroll in private or homeschool, when transitioning to middle school.



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


The north central section of the River City Middle School zone extends east of Arthur Ashe (State Rte 161) east to Cowardin Avenue (State Rte 1). It includes the Forest Hill, Forest Hill Park, Woodland Heights, Forest Hill Terrace, and portions of Northop and Reedy Creek neighborhoods. It lies entirely within the Westover Hills Elementary School zone, and three high school zones (Huguenot, Wythe, and Armstrong). The approximate center of Section 2 is approximately 4.7 miles from River City Middle School (driving).

Data for this section does not include school age students living in the zone who are not enrolled in RPS. RPS ES students may move, attend out-of-zone schools via Open Enrollment, or enroll in private or homeschool, when transitioning to middle school.



River City MS

River City Middle School was built for 1,500 students. The data below indicates the need to rezone several hundred students to Thomas C. Boushall MS and Lucille M. Brown MS. Please note that the current number of students physically attending River City MS is closer to 1,500 given that some students zoned for the school are attending Richmond Virtual Academy (RVA) or other speciality schools in the division.

Proposed Rezoning Engagement Strategies

- Rezoning Committee Work Sessions (~ 8) These work sessions will be held twice a month. Their goal will be to explore options and craft recommendations for the School Board.
- <u>Schools Board Public Hearings</u> (2) These in-person School Board meetings will be held on-site at Brown MS and Boushall MS in the winter/early spring to engage impacted community members.
- <u>Community Meetings</u> A variety of meetings will be held in-person and virtually to engage diverse stakeholders in the rezoning process. These will include meetings co-facilitated by community partners.
- <u>Community Walks</u> (20) and <u>Community Corners</u> (15) These are strategic walks and strategic presence at community-based organizations in neighborhoods impacted by rezoning to share information with families and community members.
- <u>Home Visits</u> (100) RPS engagement staff will identify specific families impacted by rezoning and conduct socially-distanced visits to their homes to provide information and get feedback on rezoning.
- <u>Arrival/Dismissal Engagement</u> (Ongoing) Weekly presence at impacted schools to provide information.
- <u>Communication Platforms</u> All information will be provided in English and Spanish for all the activities above and through the following platforms: RPS Direct, Remind app, RPS website and social media platforms, RPS Live! and ¡RPS en Vivo!; and all media channels (radio, TV, print).



Appendices 3 - Notes on the Data

Student data pulled from RPS Student Information System, Aspen, on December 21, 2021.

- 19 student records did not have an address listed that returned mappable coordinates, so were not included in the map and related data sets.
- When student demographic data was missing, the resulting aggregate summary data did not include the students with missing values.
- Address coordinates were generated using the <u>United States Census Geocoder</u> and geocoding services via Texas A&M University.
- Student locations displayed on the map and related map images are close approximations but not exact locations of a place of residence (e.g., they may appear on the road rather than the center of a land parcel)
- The RPS Zone Boundary Map was provided by Cropper GIS Inc. An interactive map is available at https://www.croppermap.com/richmond/
- The RPS Neighborhood map layer is from the Richmond City Open Data Portal at https://data.richmondgov.com/
- Enrollment totals and demographic summaries for specific sections of the RCMS zone are as of December 21, 2021, *not reported Fall Membership totals*. Information using the Fall Membership enrollment will indicate as such.
